Letters of Intent for 2018 - 2019

This letter serves as notification of my intent to run for the Combined Office of FDGA Treasurer-Secretary.

My name is Elizabeth (Beth) Kennelley and my farm is Devonshire Dairy Goats in Archer, Florida. Some of you may know me, some may not. I have raised registered Oberhasli goats for almost 20 years and have been a member of ADGA since 1995. I have actively participated in and been an advocate for many dairy goat programs including DHIR (milk records), Linear Appraisal, and CAE prevention. Over the years, I have served FDGA as an Officer (President), Director, and Show Chair. However, a few years ago, I stepped away from FDGA because I had misgivings about the direction the club was moving in at that time. Discussing this with a friend at a show last year, I was reminded that I can't fix what I see as a problem if I'm not willing to get involved...and they are right. So I rejoined FDGA at the turn of the new year. Now I hope to serve its members again, this time in the role of Treasurer-Secretary.

I bring to the table years of financial experience in both the goat world and the real world. In addition to my previous years of FDGA service, I also currently serve as the Youth Show Co-Chair for the Florida State Fair (6 years), as the Dairy Goat Show Chair for the Alachua County Youth Fair (3 years), and as the 4-H Co-Leader of The Udder Club of Alachua County. For the past five years, I have been the sole proprietor of Caprihaven Dairy Goat Products and have sold goat milk and goat milk products at our local farmers market and at multiple local festivals. I have worked with our 4-H group organizing fund-raising projects and with the Youth Fair in finding sponsorships for the Dairy Goat Show. All of these roles require that I maintain detailed, itemized budgets including documentation of show entries and fees paid, purchases/expenditures, documentation of funds raised and dispersal of those funds, and reporting market income and farm profit/loss to the IRS.

In the real world, I am employed as an Environmental Consultant where I successfully manage multiple projects with budgets of more than \$50,000 each. Reporting to various government agencies, I understand how critical it is for "cradle to grave" documentation and the need for transparency in business dealings.

I believe that I have the knowledge and experience to make a good Treasurer-Secretary. I think that my years of working with various dairy goat groups and programs along with my success in product marketing gives me an exceptional skill set to bring to FDGA. It is my hope that you, the members of FDGA, will consider me for the Combined Office of FDGA Treasurer-Secretary when it is time to vote. Thank you.

4-H Kidz Corner

I would like to introduce to you an amazing young lady. Chevene Argillander. Chevene is a proud member of the Clover Achievers 4-H group. She started her adventures with 4-H as a Cloverbud taking care and showing her rabbit and chickens with her cousin during the Osceola County Fair. She enjoyed showing so much that she started adding craft projects and baking to her long list of fair projects. During her Junior year, Chevene dove into the woodworking aspects and made a bird house and a corner shelf unit (to hold her trophies) which were both recognized and awarded a Best in Class and Best in Show ribbon. This allowed her to purchase her first goat, Goldie. Goldie was a Nigerian Dwarf and he was the best little goat with such a spunky personality. He caused the spark in her heart and her love of goats is as strong as ever today. Cheyene was able to use her 4-H

savings to purchase her first dairy goat in 2015 when her goat was just 2 days old. Cheyene had the idea of raising and breeding Fruit Stripe and using her milk to make and sell cheese and soap to her family and friends. Purchasing a baby goat at such a young age has help develop

Cheyene into the loving, caring and nurturing young lady she is becoming. She would start each morning



waking up early before school to bottle-feed her sweet goat, and then do it again after school and before bed without hesitation. Cheyene has had to face many challenges these past few years. She did not let that stop her from encouraging her 4-H friends to do the best they could do and expressed she would be back soon. She received the

1st ever Blue Ribbon! She was

so thankful for her 4-H family. After her recovery, she spent many hours working and getting show ready for the following year show. In 2016 she bred Fruit Stripe and she produced 2 beautiful bucks that looked just like their momma. Chevene sold them to a wonderful man that writes children's books, so hopefully they will be famous some day. In December of 2016 she was again devastated to know that she would be having another surgery on the opposite hip. She made the best out of what she had and told the surgeon to schedule the surgery so she could get it over and done with.

Her dedication never wavered from her goal and she was determined to do the best she could do. 1 week before the 2017 ADGA show Chevene was able to walk without the use of crutches and she was able to show Fruit Stripe. That year she was blessed with 2nd place in Showmanship and Fruit Stripe won a blue ribbon in her class. This year Cheyene decided to adventure over to the market side of the goats. She shed lots of tears during the auction of her goat but this experience has taught her a valuable lesson on becoming self-sufficient with her meat production. She plans on increasing her dairy herd and start raising market goats for the next 4-H year. These achievements would not have been possible without her dedication and her profits she has earned with her 4-H projects. I am so very proud of Cheyene's dedication to overcome any obstacles that cross her path. She is a strong willed young lady and I have no doubt she will conquer whatever life has in store for her.

an approximately 2 mile loop through the woods on fairly well maintained trails. There is some steep terrain. Children must be at least 5 years old and accompanied by an adult. (Children under 4 must be carried). Along the way we'll talk about goats as pack animals and you'll learn a thing or two about raising and caring for goats. After the hike, try your hand at goat milking, and enjoy some fresh goat milk and cookies! \$10 per adult, \$5 for kids. Minimum: 10 people; Maximum: 20 people."

Cook's Corner

SWEET CHEVRE DESSERTS

FUDGE RIBBON CAKE

Cheese Filling:

8 oz softened goat cheese 1 egg 1/4 C sugar 2 tbsp

¼ Csugar2 tbspgoat milk2 tbspbutter½ tspvanilla extract

1 tbsp cornstarch

Combine cheese, sugar, butter and cornstarch. Mix until smooth. Add egg, milk and vanilla extract. Mix until smooth. Set aside.

Cake Mix:

2 C	flour	½ tsp	baking soda
2 C	sugar	1 tsp	baking powder
½ tsp	salt 33	2/3 C	baking cocoa
1-1/3 C	goat milk	1 tsp	vanilla extract
2	eggs	½ C	softened butter

Mix all the cake ingredients. Beat until smooth. Spread $\frac{1}{2}$ of the cake batter into a greased and floured 9 x 13-inch cake pan. Spoon the cheese mixture on top. Spread the other half of the batter over top of the cheese filling.

Bake for 50-60 minutes at 350°. Let cool. Frost with whipped cream and garnish with walnuts.

INDIVIDUAL CHEESECAKES

12 vanilla wafer cookies
2 C soft goat cheese
2 eggs
2 tsp vanilla extract
cherry pie filling
or other flavor

Heat oven to 325°. Line 12 cups of a muffin pan with foil cupcake liners. Crumble or lay 1 cookie in each cup. Mix soft goat cheese with egg, sugar and vanilla extract. Beat until smooth. Pour mixture into each muffin cup.

Bake 25-30 minutes until filling is set. Allow cakes to cool in the pan. Remove and refrigerate until chilled. Top each cheesecake with a generous spoonful of your favorite pie filling.
