PLEASE NOTE: The Senior Doe & the Junior Doe shows are sanctioned separately. The Senior Bucks & Junior Bucks are Combined into one show & are not sanctioned separately.

There will be no premiums or prize monies awarded for any show. ADGA rosettes will be awarded for Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Best of Breed, and Best in Show. Separate ribbons will not be awarded for Junior and Senior Grand and Reserve Grand bucks; only for the Overall Grand and Reserve Grand bucks.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The AMERICAN DAIRY GOAT ASSOCIATION (ADGA) rules shall govern.

ENTRY FEES: ENTRIES WILL BE ONLINE THROUGH THE SHOWMAN APP

Entry fees include all 3 rings for either the Senior Doe, Junior Doe, or Sr/Jr Combined Buck Show

1. EARLY ENTRIES

***Membership form and dues payment must be received (not just postmarked) by March 1, 2023 to be eligible for the FDGA member discount. Forms are available online at <https://www.fdga.net/join>.**

Memberships expire on December 31 of each year.

Memberships initiated in February and March 2023 will expire on December 31, 2023.

PLEASE NOTE: ENTRY FEES MUST BE PAID BY 3-23-23

Only animals with completed entries through Showman will be allowed to participate in the show.

There will be NO REFUNDS or Credits for entry fees if an exhibitor chooses to cancel leave the show early. NO EXCEPTIONS.

The show committee reserves the right to waive entry fees and/or late fees at their discretion. The show committee reserves the right to refuse entry forms based on prior non-payment of entry fees.

3. ARRIVAL AND VET CHECK:

Early arrival will begin Friday, March 24, 2023 from 5:30 PM until 8:30 PM. Please notify **Korrine Johnson @ fdga.org@gmail.com** if you plan on arriving Friday. You **MUST** notify us or you will not be able to unload until the next vet check-in which will be Saturday morning. **The State Vet will be on-site from 6:00 PM – 8:30 PM.**

Regular arrival: Saturday, March 25, 2023 will be from 6:00 AM - 7:30 AM. **The State Vet will be on-site from 6:00 AM - 7:30 AM.**

Regular arrival Sunday March 26, 2023 from 7:30 AM to 9 AM. **The vet will be on-site from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM.**

An accredited state veterinarian will be checking animals **BEFORE** they are **UNLOADED** and allowed into the barn/show arena between the vet hours listed above. If you are renting stalls on-site, you may set up your pens and/or tack area prior to the vet check but your animals must be vet checked before being off-loaded into the stalls. If you are setting up pens in the parking area, you may set up pens prior to vet check and off-load your animals to those pens as they are checked.

4. REGISTRATION CHECK IN:

Check-in schedule for registration of animals is as follows:

Friday, March 24, 2023: 6:00 PM to 8:30 PM

Saturday, March 25, 2023: 6:30 AM to 8:00 AM

Sunday, March 26, 2023: 7:30 AM to 9 AM

PLEASE NOTE: A maximum of **3 substitutions** will be allowed for online entries only (a change in class is not considered a substitution).

IT IS THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE HIS/HER ANIMALS ARE CHECKED IN BEFORE THE BOOKS CLOSE AT THE TIMES LISTED ABOVE. NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER THAT TIME.

5. PENS: NEW

The facility has permanent solid-wall horse stalls (12x12) available. You may lease a stall for \$45.00 for the weekend (Friday night thru Sunday end of show).

GOATS PER STALL: **6 Large breed goats PER STALL and 10 ADULT Dwarf breed PER STALL** are allowed by the venue ACEC. 2 bags of ACEC shavings will be included with each stall rental. Additional shavings may be purchased either from the venue or brought in. **Based on the size of the stalls, 4 bags of shavings are recommended.** Stalls and the area outside the stalls **MUST** be cleaned, and all trash and debris **MUST** be removed and placed in the proper receptacle prior to departure. If you lease a horse stall, you **MUST** check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds. **Failure to do so may result in the exhibitor being banned from future FDGA shows.**

This is still considered a tailgate show and you may set up your own pens. If owner sets up his/her pens all bedding, all hay and debris **MUST** be removed and placed in the proper receptacle prior to departure. You **MUST** check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds. **Failure to do so may result in the exhibitor being banned from future FDGA shows.**

6. SHOW ATTIRE:

White, black, or dark blue pants/capris/skirts/shorts and plain white shirts are mandatory for the open senior and junior doe shows. 4-H and FFA attire is also acceptable for the youth showmanship and the open doe shows. Herd/club logos and pin-stripping on collar/sleeve is acceptable. No short shorts, cut-offs, tank tops, spaghetti straps, midriff baring, muscle shirts, tight fitting leggings, yoga pants, or other work-out clothes are allowed as show attire. Closed toed shoes or boots are required, and hats or caps are not allowed in the show ring. In the event of inclement weather, jackets and/or coats will be allowed. Exhibitors not conforming to the dress code will not be allowed to enter the ring.

The dress code for the buck show is casual but neat attire. White or black pants/capris/skirts/shorts and plain white shirts are preferred but jeans and other shirts (including t-shirts) will be allowed. Again, no short shorts, cut-offs, tank tops, spaghetti straps, midriff baring, muscle shirts, tight fitting leggings, yoga pants, or other work-out clothes are allowed as show attire. Closed toed shoes or boots are mandatory. Hats or caps are not allowed in the show ring. In the event of inclement weather, jackets and/or coats will be allowed. Exhibitors not conforming to the dress code will not be allowed to enter the ring.

Political, offensive, or other otherwise inappropriate designs on shirts will not be allowed in the showing. The show committee reserves the right to determine if shirt designs are inappropriate.

7. JUDGING:

Judging will begin at 9:00 AM on Saturday, March 26, 2023 starting with the Senior Doe Show, followed by Youth Showmanship, and concluding with the Junior Doe Show.

Judging for the Sr/Jr Combined Buck show will begin at 9:30 AM on Sunday, March 28, 2021.

The judges and their secretaries will begin in the rings listed below and move to the next ring upon completion of judging of the breeds assigned to each ring. Animals for each breed assigned to a ring should remain at ring side as the judges and secretaries move from one ring to the next.

RINGS

NOTE: The first three breeds will complete all three rings BEFORE the next three breeds will begin to show. Plan accordingly. Please also be aware that the show order will be based on entry numbers. Whichever breeds are selected to show first, will be selected to try to have equal numbers as possible in each of the three rings so they will finish close to the same time.

The breeds listed below will show in one ring for all shows; judges and secretaries will move. The Senior and Junior doe shows are separately sanctioned.

The breeds sanctioned for Senior Doe Shows are: **A** = Alpine, **L**= LaMancha, **N**=Nubian, **ND**=Nigerian Dwarf, **O**=Oberhasli, **RG**=Recorded Grade, and **AOP**=All Other Purebreds (Sables, Saanen, Toggenburg and Guernsey)

The breeds sanctioned for Junior Doe Shows are: **A** = Alpine, **L**= LaMancha, **N**=Nubian, **ND**=Nigerian Dwarf, **RG**=Recorded Grade, **O**= Oberhasli, and **AOP**=All Other Purebreds (Sables, Saanen, Toggenburg and Guernsey)

The breeds sanctioned for Combined Buck Shows are: **A**=Alpine, **L**= LaMancha, **N**=Nubian, **ND**=Nigerian Dwarf, and **AOP**=All Other Purebreds (Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg and Guernsey)

The order of the show is subject to change. The show committee reserves the right to change the order in which the breeds are judged to keep the show moving in a timely manner. Exhibitors with more than one breed need to be prepared to have additional handlers or to request the Show Committee to provide handlers so that classes are not delayed. ***The order of the show may be subject to change by the Show Committee at the request of exhibitors Showing multiple breeds or in the event of unforeseen circumstances. ***

8. SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship has been moved and is now between the Senior and Junior Doe shows. There will be three divisions:

Junior: ages 10 and under

Intermediate: ages 11 and under 14

Senior: ages 14 and under 18 (19 if still in high school)

Age group is determined by the base date of the show (March 26, 2023). The show committee reserves the right to change the age breaks depending on the number of entries per divisions. Please use entry form and list the child's name, age, division. The animal must be registered in the open show to be used in showmanship.

9. HEALTH RULES:

All goats must have a certificate of veterinary inspection and a scrapie premise number (call 352-333-3120 or visit www.aphis.usda.gov/vs/scrapie for information). A health certificate current within 90 days for goats originating in the State of Florida or 30 days for goats originating from out of state. Goats originating in the State of Florida no longer require testing for tuberculosis or brucellosis. Goats originating from out of state must have been tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis within 90 days of the show.

10. LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR THEFT

The owner or custodian of property of any kind brought to the Fairgrounds; either for exhibit or for other purposes, assumes as a condition of its admission to the grounds, all risk and/or responsibility for its loss, damage or theft. The Florida Dairy Goat Association, Inc., its officers, members and volunteers cannot and will not accept responsibility and liability for any damage or injury resulting from theft, fire, the elements, accidents, or other conditions or causes; whether

to exhibits, property of exhibitor, vehicles on the grounds and articles left therein or any other property of any nature whatsoever.

10. GENERAL:

The American Dairy Goat Association registration certificate is required on all animals 6 months of age or older. A duplicate application for registry stamped by the ADGA office is permissible for animals under 6 months of age. The registration or stamped duplicate application must be available to the show secretary at the time of arrival.

Please make sure your animals are correctly tattooed. Failure to do so makes your dairy goat ineligible to receive credit for their win.

All dairy goats must be dehorned, disbudded, or naturally polled.

The show chairperson will designate where to dump milk at check-in.

No awards will be given to any animal in any class, if in the opinion of the judge said animal does not meet breed standards.

Over-uddering of dairy goats is frowned upon. The judge shall have the authority to excuse animals from the ring for removal of excess milk.

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to properly feed, water, milk, and care for their animals. Failure to do so will result in exhibitor's immediate expulsion from the premises.

The Florida Dairy Goat Association, Inc. will use every precaution in their power to protect the animals, but they will not be held responsible for injury, fire, theft, or death.

The Show Committee shall have the authority to expel any exhibitor or any in their company for failure to abide by these rules contained herein, or for unacceptable conduct. The exhibitor and/or any in their company will also be prohibited from showing at this venue the following year. By application for admission, each exhibitor and any in their company agree that they have read, understood, and will abide by these rules and the General Rules of the FDGA (including the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and items within the "Health Regulations" section of the General Rules).

PLEASE NOTE: Dogs are not allowed at the show! If your dog accompanies you it MUST stay in camper and is NOT ALLOWED AT BARNs OR AT SHOW RING! Certified Service dogs are allowed in PUBLIC areas only. If you have a certified service dog please contact the Show board to discuss your needs regarding this policy at Korrine Johnson at FDGA.org@gmail.com

11. RELEASE:

Please leave the grounds as you found them. All bedding and trash must be removed and put into designated containers before you may leave the grounds. All exhibitors MUST check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds.

Dairy goats and exhibitors will be released following the last class in which you are showing, **unless you must remain for Best in Show.** All Best of Breeds for the Senior Doe Shows must remain for Best in Show.

PLEASE NOTE: If your doe/buck was Grand Champion and there was not a Champion Challenger, then she/he is automatically Best of Breed and must remain for Best in Show.

All exhibitors **MUST** check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds.
